Although as the editor of *JQM* my role is to initially screen the submitted manuscripts and select suitable reviewers for peer review process and finally take the decision of acceptance or rejection according to reviewers' reports; my main concern is always on the quality of the material submitted for possible publication in the *JQM*. For this, our team always ensures integrity, and maintains high quality to avoid any problem. This not only helps improve the quality of the *JQM* but also selects best of the best article. We are highly grateful to all authors who submitted their scholarly work to our journal and trusted us. 


Figure 1: Distribution of JQM Review Board by Region

Since June 2017, we have received 228 manuscripts from 19 countries Algeria, Australia, Bangladesh, China, India, Japan, Malaysia, Nepal, Nigeria, Palestine, Portugal, Sweden, Germany, Tanzania, Turkey, UK, USA, Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Zimbabwe, and Pakistan. The acceptance rate of the JQM is 10% while average desk rejection rate is 53.39%. Table 1 shows the issuewise submissions since the first volume while summary of review time (in days) is presented in table 2.






Figure 2: Submissions Breakup
